Skills, experience and qualities needed	We are interested in individuals with a wide range of different skills and experiences. In particular we're looking for individuals with strong communications skills across different mediums and good administrative and IT skills. Most importantly any volunteer must be committed to the ethos and mission of HMDT and the purpose of HMD itself, to learn from genocide for a better future.
When and where	We are looking for volunteers who would be able to start in December and continue through to the end of February.
	We would ask volunteers to be able to commit to 10-20 hours per week, between December and February – however this can be flexible.
